FAQ

Q: My child will be learning remotely, when do I get a Chromebook?

A: Students will receive their Chromebooks when they enter the classroom for the first time. Principals will make pickup arrangements for students who are learning virtually full time.

Q: Do I need to do anything with the Chromebook when first receiving it?

A: New Chromebooks are in a deep sleep mode so you will need to plug the Chromebook into the power adapter to turn it on for the first time. The Chromebook will NOT power on if you do not do this!

Q: I do not have internet at home, how do I get a hotspot?

A: The district put out a survey over the summer to learn more about what type of connectivity our students had at home. We are using that data to compile a list of students who are in need of a hotspot. Hotspots will be assigned to a specific student and dropped off to the buildings for student delivery in the classroom or parent pickup. Q: Is there any training available?

A: Students should direct their questions to their classroom teacher. Videos from this summer's training with parents are currently being edited and will be dropped on the iLearning resource page site when completed. Google also provides training called 'Getting Started with Google for Education', which is an 8-week video training program that delivers bite-size product tutorials to your inbox every Tuesday. Lessons take less than 10 minutes to complete and provide basic training!
