## Declining Enrollment

- The district has seen declining enrollments and will likely continue to see enrollments drop.
- K-12 enrollment has declined over the past 11 years.
$>$ In 2012-13: 2,211 students
$>$ In 2017-18: 1,948 students
$>$ In 2022-23: 1,689 students (23.6\% decrease from 2012-13)
- This decline is expected to continue over the next five years
$>$ In 2024-25: 1584 students
$>$ In 2027-28: 1445 students ( $14.4 \%$.decrease from 2022-23)
This future decline will impact all three grade ranges - elementary, middle school and high school.
- Area schools have seen similar decreases.

K-12 enrollment decreased 522 students or 24\% from the 2012-2013 school year to the 2022-23 school year with similar decreases in grades K-5 and 6-8. Grades 9-12 shows a $21 \%$ decrease.

## Building Condition Survey (BCS)

- Districts and BOCES must conduct building condition surveys (BCS) every 5 years.
- In 2019, a new staggered schedule was developed by the Commissioner of Education that assigned districts and BOCES when they were to conduct their BCS in the calendar years 2020-2024 and then every 5 years on that same five year schedule thereafter.
- For Oneida, the building condition survey was completed in 2020. The next BCS for the district must be conducted in 2025.
- The purpose of the BCS is to maintain buildings in an acceptable condition.
- Health and Safety items are a priority
- The survey must be conducted by an architect

$>$ Keep it for district use (i.e. Pre-K; district offices, other)
$>$ Lease it to another organization
$>$ Sell it

Size of elementary buildings - is there enough room to house elementary students in three schools?

Elementary Attendance Zones - approximately 21 \% of students are transported out of their attendance zone.

Unequal class size

Start and end times for students - depending on a grade configuration change staggered times?

Delivery of special education services among school buildings - program delivery and corresponding transportation needs

Full day Pre-K - program delivery, location

Transportation - impact of any grade configuration changes
